- ✓ Excellent Wildlife Viewing Animals gather around water sources, easier to spot.
- ✓ Pleasant Weather Warm days, minimal rain, ideal for game drives.
- ✓ Birdwatching Bonus Migratory birds still present, vibrant sightings.

Itinerary Day by Day

Day 1. 12-Feb-26 Arrive in Kilimanjaro

Your international flight will arrive at Kilimanjaro International Airport, home to the 'The Roof of Africa', Mount Kilimanjaro. After clearing immigration and collecting your luggage, you'll be met by your driver who will be waiting for you at arrivals. You'll drive to your lodge in Arusha, depends your arriving time but on a clear day you may have views of Kilimanjaro en route. After a long day travelling you may want to rest, but if you want to keep yourself busy until the evening, we can arrange canoeing on Lake Duluti or exploring the farming villages on the outskirts of Arusha by bike.

Day 2. 13-Feb-26 Spend the Day at Monduli (Community & Education Immersion Experience) After a leisurely breakfast at your hotel, we'll drive to Monduli where you'll spend the day with MBG's Director and team visiting the communities we serve, including meeting widows in their traditional mud huts to understand their daily lives, participating in our monthly donation program, and hearing their powerful personal stories.

Day 3. 14-Feb-26 Spend the Day at Monduli (Community & Education Immersion Experience) Today you'll visit a local primary school to witness the vibrant energy of Tanzanian students learning - we encourage bringing small gifts for the children and joining them during recess (they're eager to practice their budding English skills with visitors through simple conversations and games). Both experiences offer meaningful cultural exchange and unforgettable opportunities to connect with the local community.

Day 4. 15-Feb-26 Tarangire National Park.

You have a full day to explore Tarangire with your guide Explore Tarangire National Park, where ancient baobab trees tower over some of the largest herds of elephants in all of Africa. Keep a lookout for the hundreds of bird species Tarangire is known for—and dramatic interactions between predator and prey at the park's watering holes.

The landscapes around you will vary between open plains, swamps, majestic baobab trees and riverine forest, with the dramatic backdrop of the Ol Doinyo Lengai volcano in the distance.

Day 5. 16-Feb-26 Ngorongoro Crater

Descend into Ngorongoro Crater to explore the panoramic, game-rich prairies of this ancient volcanic caldera. With its crater walls nearly 2,000 feet high, Ngorongoro offers the safari experience of a lifetime. Observe profuse and diverse wildlife roaming freely in an authentic "Lost World," where it's possible to encounter every member of the Big Five in a single day. Enjoy lunch al fresco in this UNESCO World Heritage Site before returning to your lodge. Tonight, gather for dinner with your fellow guests.

Day 6. 17-Feb-26 Ndutu Ngorongoro

Today, we set our sights on the legendary Serengeti National Park, famous for its vast plains and extraordinary wildlife sightings. Heading towards the south region of the park, you'll embark on game drives in search of the park's resident predators and migratory herds. Your guide will provide expert commentary on the park's ecosystem and animal behaviour as you traverse the savannah. Lunch will be served at a picturesque spot within the park, offering uninterrupted views of the Serengeti's beauty. After a full day of exploration, return to your lodge for dinner and overnight stay.

Day 7. 18-Feb-26 Ndutu Ngorongoro

Stunned by the previous day's spotting of the migration, today you get another chance to view the beautiful wildlife spectacle. The Ndutu region is a part of the glorious Serengeti National Park as well as the Ngorongoro Conservation Area (Ngorongoro). You can either have a relaxed breakfast and depart for full day game drives around 9:00 AM with packed lunch and return back to lodge late afternoon around 6:00 PM. Or you can depart at 6:00 AM on an early morning game drive. Later return to accommodation for breakfast and relax for a bit and depart on an afternoon game drive

with packed lunch. Today you will be following the migration depending on its location. During game drives at the right season between December and April, you will be able to see the fertile plains turn into calving grounds and nursery for the great migration. This season attracts hordes of predators preying on vulnerable young wildebeest. Watching the circle of life take its course will be an unforgettable experience etched for life. The action-packed game drive will end late in the evening by around 5PM. You will now head towards your choice of accommodation, where a freshly prepared dinner awaits you. Ensure you get some good rest and recharge yourself for another eventful day.

Day 8. 19-Feb-26 Serengeti National Park

Head for the iconic Serengeti, where acacia trees and granite kopjes dot the seas of waving grass. The Serengeti offers everyday opportunities to spot Tanzania's most impressive wildlife-including big cats, Serengeti is home to one of the world's largest concentrations of wildlife, with lions, hyenas and leopards all roaming free.

For a portion of each year, dictated by weather patterns and the unpredictable nature of wild animals. This evening, sip a cocktail and reflect on the majesty of Africa during a relaxing Scenic Sundowner experience.

Day 9. 20-Feb-26 Serengeti National Park

The Serengeti's soul lies in its ever-changing canvas—golden grasslands stretching to the horizon, interrupted by ancient kopies (rock islands) where lions bask like royalty. Dust devils spiral into the sky, and the distant silhouette of a giraffe turns the savanna into a living painting.

As the first golden light spills over the endless plains, you set out, camera poised, into a world where the wild reigns supreme. The air hums with anticipation—every rustle of grass, every distant call could signal a breathtaking encounter. This is the Central Serengeti, where nature's drama unfolds on an epic scale, and no two moments are alike

Day 10. 21-Feb-26 Serengeti /Fly out

Morning game drive in the Serengeti National Park, spend your last day in the Serengeti National Park, making the most of the sweeping open plains of the Serengeti and trying to see as much wildlife as possible. Other than the Big Five, species to look out for include wild-dogs, giraffe, wildebeest and spotted hyenas. The birdlife in the Serengeti is also spectacular, with over 500 species recorded here, including a variety of different bustards, lilac-breasted rollers and starlings with distinctive shimmering wings.

You will then be transferred to the Seronera Airstrip ready to fly back to arusha for the hot lunch, and then transferred to the Kilimanjaro Airport for the evening flight back home.
